#20 HOLDING ON TO OUR FAITH: WHEN WE ARE DISAPPOINTED

- Moses: Deuteronomy 32:52 Therefore, you will see the land only from a distance; you will not enter the land I am giving to the people of Israel."
 Mary and Martha
 Jesus' disciples
- The Old Testament faithful: Hebrews 11:39 These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised, ⁴⁰ since God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect. Solomon: Ecclesiastes 2:20 Therefore I completely despaired of all the fruit of my labor for which I had labored under the sun. God! Genesis 6:6 The Lord was sorry that he had made man on the earth, and he was grieved in his heart.

Lessons from Jesus' conversation with Mary and Martha:

- 1) *Jesus' delay was not because he was unaware or didn't care!* It wasn't because Lazarus or the sisters—had sinned. *And it was <u>not</u> a mistake.* This was ______ the _____.
- 2) Jesus delayed because he _____ Lazarus (11:5-6) and he planned to show his
- (11:4). He demonstrated both by raising Lazarus back to life from the dead.
 The sisters ______ have their prayer answered—their brother was alive; and God received the glory as this incident caused many people to put their faith in Jesus.

Kaitlin Miller: "Could it be that these are the same reasons he has for allowing our disappointments too? Could his love for you and his desire to show his glory be the train tracks that led you to the circumstances in which you find yourself today? And if so, would it change your perspective, your prayers, your hope?" Would we look at our disappointments differently?

Pressing in:

- God saw the devastation of Hagar in the desert (Genesis 16:7-10, 13) and the heartache of Leah (29:31-32). He saw the injustice done to Jacob (31:42) and the suffering, enslavement, and misery of the Israelites (Exodus 2:23–24; 3:7–9). *He sees ______ today.*
- Jesus bore our griefs and carried our sorrows (Isaiah 53:4)
- In the end, God will wipe away every tear from our eye (Revelation 21:4)
- Until then, he promises to ______ to the ______ and saved the crushed in spirit (Psalm 34:18)
