The term "blessing" may refer to:

- The actual words spoken: "Blessed are those who hear the word of God and obey it."
- The act by which a blessing is given: "We are going to be blessing our city as we pray."
- The specific gift conferred: "Sent off by the believers with the blessing of peace."

There are two primary words for "blessing" in the Bible. In the OT, the Hebrew verb "to bless" is (barak), and its noun form, "blessing," is $\Box (berakah)$.
